They can run up your score but these two adjustments made for tournament play are also frequently blamed for slow play. In my mind this is not true. I'm living proof that one can shoot a high score and still play fast. The key to keeping up with the group in front of you is not picking up and not putting out. The key is managing your play in the fairway, i.e. going to your ball instead of BSing and playing ready golf from the tee, to and through the green. The best etiquette you can offer fellow players on the course is getting out of their way so they can enjoy their round too. So when you're out there just playing with your buds, practice making up time on the tee and in the fairway. You will give yourself time to putt out those short putts and you just might shoot a better round in your next tourney.
